

The Oliver Trophy to highest placed junior member riding a pony 148 cm (14.2hh) and under THRC Cup to highest placed senior member

Class 5 75cm (2ft 6")

The Bentley Country Park Shield to highest placed senior member

The Simon Trophy to highest placed junior member riding a pony 148 cm (14.2h) and under

Class 6 85cm (2ft 9")

The Sebastian Senior Trophy – Senior member, riding a horse over 148 cm (14.2hh) The Lowry Cup – Junior member on pony 148 cm (14.2h) and under

Class 7 90cm (3ft)

The Chisnell Trophy to highest placed senior member.

The Hill House Farm shield to highest placed Young Rider THRC member 21 years and under, riding a horse/pony over 138cm

Class 8 1m (3ft 3")

The Greyhound Caravan Open Trophy to highest placed member

Class 9 1.05m (3ft 6")

The Tendring Hundred Riding Club Rose Bowl to highest placed member

Class 10 1.10m (3ft 9") Horses only

The `Thorpe Marke Trophy to highest placed member

Show Jumping Specific Rules

British Riding Clubs Rules apply

All heights are approximate.

 No Horse to jump in more than 3 show jumping classes. A Horse/Pony may only compete once in a class.





 Whips (Show Jumping and Cross-Country) One whip is permitted and must be between 45cm and 75cm and must not be weighted or feature a hard point at the end. The end of the whip must be padded. The 'pad' must be smooth with no protrusion or raised surface (which includes embroidery) and be made of a shock absorbing material throughout its circumference. No substitute for a whip may be carried. PLEASE SEE HAT STANDARDS BELOW

Ring 2 – In-Hand Showing Classes (Morning) - 9:00am prompt.

- Class 11 In-Hand Coloured Horse or Pony (Piebald, skewbald, spots, duns, palominos & roans)
- Class 12 In-Hand Cob Type (Hogged or hairy, any colour, any height)
- Class 13 In-Hand Mountain and Moorland Small Breeds (Welsh A & B, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetlands: registered or unregistered).
- Class 14 In-Hand Mountain and Moorland Large Breeds
 (Highland, Dales, Fell, Welsh C & D, New Forest, Connemara: registered or unregistered).
- Class 15 In-Hand Riding Horse/Hunter Type *Special rosette to best ex-racehorse*
- Class 16: In-Hand Novice Horse/Pony

Any breed/type, any age. Not to have won 2 x 1st places in an in-hand class before Jan 1st 2025. Class may be split if entries warrant.

Class 17 In-Hand Veteran Horse or Pony (15 years and over)

Special rosettes for best horse/pony 20- 23 years & 24 years and over. (Class may be split at the discretion of the judge) **Please state age of the horse/pony when entering.**

Class 18 Young Handler (Handler 16 years and under)

Rosettes to all competitors, plus a special rosette to the best handler aged 10 or under
(Class may be split at discretion of the judge – please state handler's age at time of entry)

***In-Hand Championship ~ 1st & 2nd place winners from Classes 11-18 ***

Ring 2 - Ridden Showing Classes (Afternoon) - Not Before 12.30pm

Class 19 Ridden Novice Horse/Pony

(Any breed/type, any age. Not to have won 2 x 1st places in a ridden class before Jan 1st 2025. **Class** may be split if entries warrant.)

- Class 20
 Lead Rein Pony (Any breed/type 12.2HH and under rider 10 years and under but must be at least 3 years of age snaffle bits only lead rein attached to noseband. Rosettes to all entries)
- **Class 21**First Ridden Pony (Any breed/type 13.2HH and under rider 12 years and under but must be at least 3 years of age. Rosettes to all entries.
- Class 22 Mountain and Moorland Small Breeds

(Welsh A & B, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetlands: registered or unregistered).

Class 23 Mountain and Moorland Large Breeds

(Highland, Dales, Fell, Welsh C & D, New Forest, Connemara: registered or unregistered)

- Class 24 Riding Horse/Hunter Type *Special rosette to best ex-racehorse*
 - **The 'Olive Shepherd Memorial Trophy' to the highest placed THRC member. **
 - **Second Chance Shield' to highest placed members ex- Racehorse**





Class 25 Coloured Horse or Pony (Piebald, skewbald, spots, duns, palominos & roans)

Class 26 Cob Type (Hogged or hairy, any colour, any height)

*The 'The Carter Trophy' to the highest placed THRC member. **

***Ridden Championship ~ 1st & 2nd place winners from Classes 19-26 ***

Ring 3 – Ridden Performance & Veteran Ring TO START @ 12.00pm

Class 27 Riding Club Horse (Exceeding 14.2hh)

Will be required to jump two or three fences approx. 75cm to 85cm (2ft 6" to 2ft 9") To be judged on suitability for all Riding Club activities

The Chaeron Ford Memorial Trophy to highest placed member

Class 28 Riding Club Pony (14.2hh and under)

Will be required to jump two or three fences approx. 70cm (2ft 3")

To be judged on suitability for all Riding / Pony Club activities. *A new Trophy to highest placed member**

Class 29 Family Pony (14.2hh and under)

Rider any age. Will be required to jump a small jump and negotiate an obstacle. To be judged on suitability to be ridden by both adult and child family members. Snaffle bits only. **The Meridian Business Machines Cup to Highest Placed THRC Member**

Class 30 Family Horse (Over 14.2hh)

Rider any age. Will be required to jump a small jump and negotiate an obstacle. To be judged on suitability to be ridden by both adult and child family members. Snaffle bits only. **The Premier Tyres Trophy to Highest Placed THRC Member**

Class 31 Ridden Veteran Pony (15 years and over)

The 'Bronwyn Trophy' to the highest placed THRC member on a pony 14.2hh and under. Special rosettes for best horse/pony 20- 23 years & 24 years and over. **Please state age of horse/pony when entering.**

Class 32 Ridden Veteran Horse (15 years and over)

The 'Soulbury Golden Greeting Trophy' to the highest placed THRC member on a horse. ** Special rosettes for best horse/pony 20- 23 years & 24 years and over. **Please state age of horse/pony when entering.

***Ring 3 Championship ~ 1st & 2nd place winners from Classes 27-32 ***

Tendring Hundred Riding Club Event Rules & Information

Health and Safety

Tendring Hundred Riding Club has taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of
everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to
avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organisers /stewards
whether written or verbal. All attendees at THRC events must conduct themselves so that they do not put
themselves or anyone else at risk.





• HATS must be worn whenever mounted and conform to PAS015 (2011), VG01.040 2014-12 with a BSI Kite mark or Inspec IC mark, ASTM F1163.2004a onwards with SEI mark, SNELL 2016 (with official SNELL label and number) or AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards.) For up-to-date hat rules please see the current 2025 BRC Rule Book. Any other standards/dates are NOT acceptable.

Insurance

- All THRC members will be covered by their BRC insurance. Non-members are not covered by BRC insurance. It is mandatory for non-members attending THRC events to have third party liability insurance.
- Tendring Hundred Riding Club shall not be liable for any claim in respect of damage, loss, injury or accident to any person, horse or property howsoever caused. It shall be deemed a condition of entry that each entrant has read and understood these terms and conditions and shall indemnify THRC or any person acting on their behalf against any legal action arising from such an incident.

Safeguarding

The protection of children, young people and adults at risk while participating in any sport is of the highest importance as they should be able to take part in a fun, safe environment and be protected from harm. Tendring Hundred Riding Club is affiliated to British Riding Clubs and as such adheres to the BHS Policy on safeguarding, details of which can be found at http://www.bhs.org.uk/safeguardingchildren. THRC as an affiliate of British Riding Clubs reserves the right to restrict or prohibit attendance at any of its events to anyone who BRC considers to be an unsuitable person. Code of Conduct

THRC believes that it is important that members, coaches, parents/carers and all associated volunteers should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others. In view of this THRC expects everyone to abide by the following general code of conduct:

Participants and Members should:

- Show respect for their ponies and horses, instructors, officials, competition organisers and stewards and their fellow members/competitors.
- Abide by the rules of the competition and accept the decisions of the event stewards and organisers.
- Query a decision they do not understand in a polite manner and listen to the explanation.
- Support the other members of their team (where relevant) and also the other members of the
 organization.
- Report any inappropriate behaviour.

They should not:

- Possess or consume alcohol or illegal and performance-enhancing drugs
- Smoke
- Use foul language
- Tolerate or be involved in discrimination of any kind
- Criticise officials, instructors, volunteers or members on social networking sites or by the use of text messaging.

Photographs

Please be advised that photographs may be taken at THRC's events. If you do not wish to appear in any images captured, please inform the secretary so that we can take appropriate steps to ensure you are not included. The photos and results could potentially be included in any media and may also be published on Tendring Hundred Riding Club's website and social media. By entering a class, you agree to photos being taken and shared with the media. If you do not want this to happen, you must tell us (and the on-site photographer if applicable) before or on the day.

General Rules

- All ridden horses/ponies must be four years old or over.
- Junior handlers/riders must be at least 3 years old.
- All stallions/colts must be kept under control at all times and not handled or ridden by anyone under 17
 years of age. All stallions must wear a stallion disc on the bridle.
- Please park vehicles sensibly and do not block any entrances.
- · Please pick up all droppings.
- No lunging on the showground, please.
- Please remove all rubbish/litter or place in the bins provided.
- · Please keep all dogs on leads and clean up all droppings.
- All children under the age of 16 years must always be supervised by a responsible adult.
- Judged under British Riding Clubs Rules. The Judge's decision is final.
- Only competing horses/ponies may be ridden on the showground on show days.
- · All entries are payable at time of booking.

Dress Guidelines

- Riders/handlers to be correctly turned out i.e., jacket, shirt and tie/stock (juniors must have long sleeves), breeches / jodhpurs, boots, tidy hair either in a hairnet or tied above the collar. Junior handlers must wear a hard hat of the correct standard. See above for hat standards.
- **Boots:** Long riding boots designed for riding are to be worn. Short riding boots with gaiters of the same leather and colour may be worn. Suede half chaps may be worn providing they are of identical colour to the boots.
- **Gloves:** Gloves must be worn in dressage and showing competitions. For show jumping, arena eventing and cross-country competitions gloves are optional although are recommended.
- **Body Protectors:** A body protector is obligatory in all cross-country competitions and is strongly recommended in show jumping and working hunter competitions. A BETA Level 3 Blue 2018 Label must be worn in competitions where a body protector is obligatory.

All heights are approximate.

- No Horse to jump in more than 3 show jumping classes. A Horse/Pony may only compete once in a class
- Whips (Show Jumping and Cross-Country) One whip is permitted and must be between 45cm and 75cm and must not be weighted or feature a hard point at the end. The end of the whip must be padded. The 'pad' must be smooth with no protrusion or raised surface (which includes embroidery) and be made of a

shock absorbing material throughout its circumference. No substitute for a whip may be carried.
